

In addition to the strides being made on Phase 9, the construction team has ambitiously pledged to break ground on 16 new homes at Stratton Flats in 2024, doubling our historic progress! The new 16 homes will be on the north side of Nighthawk Circle, across the street from Phases 8 & 9.

To make this goal possible, Habitat is fortunate to partner with three amazing, local architects and engineers. Greg Sparhawk, owner of GPS Designs, is our design architect for the project and has donated over \$200,000 of services to Habitat over the past 5 years. Landon Anderson, owner of Anderson Structural Engineering, Inc., has also donated his services for the past 3 phases of Habitat projects. Justin Yarnell, owner of Yarnell Consulting & Civil Design, our civil engineer on the project, kindly discounts his services and is willing to help with all of Habitat's civil engineering needs including Adam's Way, Grace Ave, and other past projects!

Other progress on Phase 10 includes installing a new transformer to service our new homes with electricity. We hope to receive our building permits from the Town of Gypsum in the coming weeks and begin earthwork soon after! We are eager to begin and are so thankful for the amazing community partnerships our project has already received.

Stick Framed garages completed

February was another busy month at Adam's Way. Nottingham Excavation continued their hard work, excavating the eight remaining foundations as well as backfilling the set boxes. All Purpose Enterprises continued to pour concrete, despite the cold temperatures. The first eight units consisted of shallow foundation walls making up a crawl space. The most recent eight foundations consist of tall walls that are both part of the dirt retention plan for the site and will form the garages that will sit under the set modules. The team is eager to set the remaining boxes in the upcoming weeks.

Mountain States Framing was also busy. They completed the stick framed garages that sit adjacent to the eight homes already set as well as starting on the front porch construction. They also installed the roof truss systems for the boxes in place.




















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
